PURPOSE

The Mariological Society of America (MSA) is a Catholic theological association dedicated to studying and making known the role of the Blessed Virgin Mary in the mystery of Christ and the Church and in the history of salvation. Through its annual meeting and its publication, *Marian Studies*, the Society seeks to promote original research in Marian doctrine and devotion.

HISTORY

The Mariological Society of America was founded by Fr. Juniper B. Carol, O.F.M., in October 1949. The charter members gathered for the first meeting in Washington, D.C., in January 1950. Since that time, the MSA has met annually in various cities throughout the U.S.A. In 1954, the Society was recognized as a corporation "organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational and scientific purposes." Listed in the *Official Catholic Directory* as one of the national organizations of the United States Catholic Conference, it is recognized as a tax-exempt organization. Since 1979, the office of the executive secretary of the MSA has been located at the Marian Library of the University of Dayton.

ORGANIZATION

The organizational structure is found in the *Bylaws of the Mariological Society of America* (revised in 1990, 2004, and currently in review). The MSA is governed by an Administrative Council composed of the Officers (President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer) and six councilors (who serve in pairs on Program, Planning, and Promotion Offices). The Administrative Council is responsible for the annual meeting and additional programming, and it approves Society by-laws and major expenditures.

MEMBERSHIP

Professional membership is open to persons with an academic degree in theology (or its equivalent). **Associate** membership is for individuals (or groups) who share the MSA's aims. Persons living or working outside the U.S.A. are also welcome to join the Society.

ANNUAL NATIONAL MEETING

The MSA holds an annual meeting. The site, theme, and speakers are decided by the Administrative Council. Anyone may attend the sessions of an annual meeting; however, voting (at business meetings) is restricted to professional members in good standing.

MARIAN STUDIES

Marian Studies is the primary publication of the MSA, consisting of the peer-reviewed proceedings of the annual national meeting. Beginning with the proceedings of the 2014 meeting, *Marian Studies* became an open-access online publication. Volumes 1 (1950) through 67 (2016) are currently available at: http://ecommons.udayton.edu/marian_studies/about.html. *Note:* Pre-printed back issues are no longer available, but one may order an individual printing of a digital volume by going to the above website and linking to the desired volume number.

THE CARDINAL JOHN J. WRIGHT MARIOLOGICAL AWARD

Conferred in memory of Cardinal John J. Wright (longtime MSA member and its episcopal chairman from 1951 until his death in 1979) and as redefined by the MSA Board in 1991, the award is given (upon recommendation of a designated three-member committee) to recognize and encourage significant publications on the Virgin Mary. The recipient need not be a member of the MSA.

ARTHUR W. CLINTON, JR. SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS

The MSA used the bequest of Mr. Arthur W. Clinton, Jr. (a longtime Associate Member who died in 1992) to establish a fund to promote scholarly Marian pursuits. These funds may be used to support research and writing with a Marian focus. The money may also be used to cover special expenses related to the MSA's annual meeting or for other MSA-sponsored projects. Procedures for requesting such aid may be found on the MSA website and at the end of *Marian Studies*. Awardees are typically selected in April of each year and announced at the annual MSA meeting in May.

REGIONAL UNITS

Regional units of the MSA share the same goals as the national organization but are organizationally independent. Meetings of regional units are frequently pastoral in tone and content. Areas in which regional units have been active are New England (Rhode Island) and the West Coast (San Francisco area). No regional units are active at the present time.
